On **Friday** morning Divided Sky motored through Knapps Narrows on a low tide. Although challenging, it was successful with little water under the 4 ft 3" keel. Once out of the Narrows the genoa was up and we began our sail and motored to Hunting creek. Around 11 Am Mystic left the dock and motored to Bloody Point before raising the sails. After rounding Tilghman Point both boats motored to hunting creek and rafted for an enjoyable evening on Divided Sky. When attempting to raft Divided Sky managed to wrap the dingy tow line around the propeller. This called for the captain to go overboard to cut the tangled lines and free the prop.

Aboard Divided Sky



It was at 11:30 when we reached the Narrows and a record time of 2.5 hours for Divided Sky's best time from St Michaels to Tilghman.
