

Part I - June 4 through June 7, 2017 Cruise Captains: Dennis & Stephanie Sokso aboard *DIVIDED SKY*

Participating Boats: Capricorn, Divided Sky, Jasmine, Karaya, Mistral, Onyx, Tryst

SUNDAY, JUNE 4 - Capricorn, Onyx and Divided Sky left home ports with south winds 5-12mph and tacked and motored our way to Mill Creek just outside of Old House Cove in Solomons. Tryst, Karaya, Jasmine and Mistral met us there - they had all left on Saturday to take advantage of the north winds. At 5:30, Divided Sky rafted with Jasmine, hosted a gathering and all attended for a wonderful evening.

MONDAY, JUNE 5 - Was a lay day due to heavy rains and thunderstorms forecasted. Scattered rain prevailed but ended late in the afternoon. Jasmine hosted a gathering with Tryst rafted up and everyone enjoyed the evening and the clearing skies.

TUESDAY, JUNE 6 - With winds forecasted out of the NW at 5-10mph seven boats left the anchorage by 8:30. With the wind directly behind us we made our way down the bay. As we rounded Point Look Out to head up the Potomac, we faced strong (20mph & up) head winds. Most boats reduced sail and tacked their way to the Yeocomico River. Some boats, like Tryst and Onyx, enjoyed the tacking more than others. All boats arrived at Olverson's Lodge Marina between 3-4pm and most of us were worn out. Resting and settling in took preference to gathering for cocktails that evening.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 7 - Was a lay day. Most boaters went to town for supplies while others worked on boat projects or just explored the marina in the morning. At 2pm many gathered for several games of Mexican train and a highly active (husbands vs. wives) game of Catch Phrase. At 5pm we loaded into three loaner cars/vans and drove 23 miles to Lowery's restaurant in Tappahannock, VA and enjoyed a nice meal.
