

Impromptu Frostbite Cruise

Thursday, October 19 – Friday, October 20



Thursday morning, Mistral left the anchorage in LaTrappe Creek behind Martin Point, having spent a rather cool night (mid 40's) on the hook. It was a sunny day, and the winds were out of the south at 12 – 15 knots, which made for a pleasant sail to Harris Creek.

We met Divided Sky coming out of Harris Creek for a day sail. The winds were a steady 15+ with a forecast of increasing winds overnight. We proceeded to the anchorage at the south end of Dun Cove. After her sail, Divided Sky joined us. There was one other Canadian flagged boat named Jabiroo II in the anchorage.

Denny, Stephanie, and their new neighbor, JoAnne, joined us for cocktails at 4:30. JoAnne had just moved to Tilghman from Florida. She had grown up in MD and had sailed with her family as a child. She really enjoyed her sail on Divided Sky.

Shortly thereafter, we saw man in a dinghy approaching from Jabiroo II. Upon reaching Mistral, he asked if he could join us. Of course, Dave said yes. So, we met Stephen Teatro. He and his wife Ginny have been live aboards for many years, hailing originally from Victoria Island, British Columbia. He was currently sailing single handed, as his wife was undergoing medical treatment. He hoped she would be able to join him soon. His destination was Guatemala.

We spent a very congenial couple of hours trading sailing stories before breaking up for the evening. After returning JoAnne to land, Denny and Stephanie stayed overnight on Divided Sky and left early the next morning for their long trip across the anchorage to their dock.
